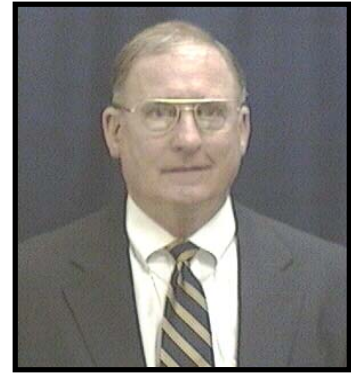


BRIGADIER GENERAL (RETIRED) ROBERT M. MURDOCK



Brig. Gen. (Ret.) Robert Murdock entered the Air Force in 1970 through the ROTC program at Davis and Elkins College. His early career included experience as a C-130 and C-5 pilot and aircraft commander, Air Staff Training Officer, a Headquarters Military Airlift Command staff officer, and aide-de-camp to the Chief of Staff at Headquarters U.S. Air Force. He received the Mackay Trophy for the most meritorious flight of 1977. Later he served as a C-5 squadron operations officer and commander, air base group deputy commander, deputy inspector general at U.S. European Command, airlift wing vice commander, and commander of the Air Force Inspection Agency. After serving as the Deputy U. S. Military Representative at NATO Headquarters, General Murdock was assigned to Kelly AFB, initially as the Vice Commander and then Commander of the San Antonio Air Logistics Center. As the base prepared for closure and realignment in July 2001, the general oversaw the engine and aircraft workload transitions to other Air Force logistics centers. The transition included material management and depot repair facilities, equipment, people and processes, as well as the realignment of selected base support activities to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. General Murdock retired from the Air Force on July 13, 2001, concurrent with the closure of Kelly AFB.

In February 2002, General Murdock became the manager in charge of the San Antonio branch office of Guardsmark, LLC. In that position, he directed the day to day operations providing security services to clients in San Antonio and Corpus Christi.

General Murdock joined the City of San Antonio on March 5, 2007 as the new Director of the Office of Military Transformation (OMT). His office will work in partnership with local military installations and the community to address the challenges and opportunities arising as a result of the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) law.

General Murdock holds a B.A. from Davis and Elkins College, a M.A. from Central Michigan University and is a graduate of the United States Army War College. General Murdock serves on the Board of Directors of the United Way of San Antonio and the USO Council of San Antonio. He is married and has a daughter who is a LT. JG. in the U.S. Navy.
